## "Just-Right" Books

#### Also called: Leveled Books

# Children start looking at the print.



## Which books are "JUST RIGHT" for you?




# "A" books have a simple pattern on every

page.

Example:

- I go to the park.
- I go to the pool.
- I go to the game.






# In "B" books, the pattern changes on the last page.


Example:

A farm has cows. A farm has chickens. We need farms!









As your child reads an A/B Book they should be able to:


- Use the pattern.
- Point under each word.
- Use the pictures to help them read.

### In "C" books, children start using the sounds of letters to figure out

Example: " I see a light. Is it the sun? Is it a star? It is the moon!












# Students start to identify "sight words" without sounding it out.



### In "D" books, children begin to identify the story elements. For example: characters, setting, beginning, middle, and end.



It was Thanksgiving. Mom said, "I'm too sick to cook."





It was the best Thanksgiving!



### "D" books may contain dialogue between characters and elicit different feelings. There is less visual support for decoding.




# What level is my child?

Children are assessed (tested) to determine what level is "just right."

This includes

• reading the words correctly and

demonstrating comprehension



### Children need to be able to answer some comprehension questions and retell key details of the story in order to move to the next reading level.
